

10 dead, many injured as military jet accidentally strikes Sokoto communities

military airstrike targeting the Lakurawa terrorist group has reportedly claimed the lives of several villagers and left many injured in Silame Local Government Area of Sokoto State.

The incident, which occurred at approximately 7 a.m. on Wednesday, affected the communities of Gidan Sama and Rumtuwa. Residents revealed that the two villages are situated near Surame Forest, a known hideout for the Lakurawa group and other bandits.

Malam Yahya, a local resident, reported that the airstrike, intended to target terrorists, mistakenly hit civilian settlements. Another source disclosed that over 10 villagers lost their lives, while many others sustained various injuries during the incident.

Confirming the unfortunate event, the



chairman of Silame LGA, Alhaji Abubakar Muhammad Daftarana, stated that authorities are still assessing the extent of the damage caused by the strike.

"The villagers were sitting peacefully when the bombs started dropping on the communities. They were innocent and peace-loving people who had no any criminal record.

"It was early for me to confirm the number of people either killed or injured because we are still assessing the development," he said.

When contacted the Spokesman of the Sokoto State Police Command, ASP Ahmad Rufa'i declined comment on the matter, saying it was not the police operation.

33 inmates killed, 1,500 escape in Mozambique

More than 1,500 prisoners escaped from a Maputo prison on Wednesday, taking advantage of the third day of unrest triggered by the controversial confirmation of the long-ruling Frelimo party as the winner of recent elections.

A total of 1,534 detainees escaped the high-security prison located about 15km (nine miles) from the capital, national police chief, Bernardino Rafael said at a press conference.

Among those attempting to escape, 33 were killed and 15 wounded in clashes with prison staff, he added.

A search operation, backed by the army, led to the arrest of about 150 fugitives, he said.

Around 30 of the prisoners were linked to armed groups that have been behind unrest and attacks in the northern province of Cabo Delgado for the past seven years.

"We are particularly concerned about this situation," Rafael said.

The Portuguese-speaking African country's highest court had confirmed on Monday that Frelimo, in power since 1975, won the October 9 presidential election that had already triggered



weeks of unrest.

Groups of protesters had approached the penitentiary on Wednesday, creating confusion and triggering unrest inside the prison, where inmates ended up knocking down a wall through which they escaped, he explained.

Barricades remained erected in several areas of the capital on Wednesday, limiting movements, as acts of vandalism continued.

In addition to stores and public buildings that were already ransacked on Monday, ambulances were set ablaze along with a pharmacy and other businesses.

Some demonstrators also set up tables in the streets to occupy the space while celebrating

Christmas with family or neighbours in several workingclass districts of Maputo.

Monday's confirmation of the election result came despite claims of irregularities from many observers.

Frelimo leader, Daniel Chapo won 65.17 per cent of the vote, about five points less than the initial results declared by the country's electoral commission.

Chapo's main challenger, exiled opposition leader Venancio Mondlane, has claimed the election was rigged, sparking fears of violence between rival party supporters.

The unrest has claimed the lives of at least 150 people, according to several NGO reports.

14 Nigerians declared wanted by INTERPOL for human, drug trafficking

he International Police (INTERPOL) has declared 14 Nigerians wanted for offences ranging from human trafficking, drug trafficking, robbery, cheating, and forgery, among others.

Red Notices published on the INTERPOL website on Tuesday stated that the 14 Nigerians were wanted by different countries where they had allegedly committed the crime.

According to the notices, the wanted persons were identified as Felix Omoregie, Jessica Edosomwan, Uche Egbue, Jude Uzoma, Chinedu Ezeunara, Benedict Okoro, Ikechukwu Obidiozor, and Alachi Stanley.

Others are Bouhari Salif, Timloh Nkem, Austine Costa, Okromi Festus, Akachi Vitus and Mary Eze.

According to the notices, Omoregie is wanted by the Belgian authority for allegedly leading a criminal organisation that exploits minors for prostitution.

It read, "Family name: Omoregie, Forename: Felix, Gender: Male, Date of birth: 22/10/1977 (47 years old), Nationality: Nigeria.

"Charges published as provided by requesting entity: Sexual exploitation or exploitation of prostitution of minors over 16 years of age; Sexual exploitation or exploitation of prostitution of another person/Leader of a criminal organisation/Human trafficking for the purpose of prostitution or other forms of sexual exploitation."

The notice on Edosomwan indicated that she is wanted by the French authority for "multiple victims trafficking in human beings, committed against several persons.



Organised gang competition in an operation of placing concealing or converting the proceeds of an offence."

It indicated that Egbue is wanted by authorities in Argentina for alleged drug trafficking, while Uzoma is wanted by the Brazilian government for alleged drug trafficking, Ezeunara is wanted by the Uruguayan government for alleged drug trafficking, and Okoro is wanted by the Nicaragua government for alleged organised crime.

Further checks on the INTERPOL website by our correspondent on Tuesday indicated that Obidiozor, Vitus and Stanley are wanted by the Angolan government for alleged "kidnapping, robbery and illegal possession of firearms."

Other notices by the INTERPOL indicated that Eze is wanted by Denmark for alleged "traffic in human beings", Salif by China for alleged "drug smuggling", and Nkem by Canada for alleged "sexual assault, and failure to comply with a condition of recognisance."

Costa, according to the published

notices, is wanted by India for alleged "criminal conspiracy; having possession of document knowing it to be forged and intending to use it as genuine; forgery of valuable security, will etc; forgery for purpose of cheating" and Okromi is also wanted by India for "criminal conspiracy and cheating."

INTERPOL, however, noted that the notices were aimed at alerting the public to possible threats and seeking help in locating an individual.

The statement read, "A Red Notice is a request to law enforcement worldwide to locate and provisionally arrest a person pending extradition, surrender, or similar legal action. A Red Notice is not an international arrest warrant.

"The individuals are wanted by the requesting member country or international tribunal. Member countries apply their laws in deciding whether to arrest a person."

It urged members of the public to report to their local police authorities should they have information about the wanted persons.

Christmas eve drone strike by suspected terrorists on a military base in Borno State has injured at least six soldiers.

According to SaharaReporters, the terrorists attacked the Forward Operating Base in Wajiroko in the Damboa Local Government Area on Tuesday afternoon.

A soldier, who witnessed the incident said they heard what sounded like a jet followed by a huge explosion.

He added that the terrorists had initially attacked the base shooting sporadically but were repelled by the troops.

A military signal obtained by SaharaReporters confirmed the incident.

The signal added that a gun truck belonging to the army was damaged after the terrorists used multiple drones to attack the base.

Delta man beheads friend over N50m

n a chilling case that has shocked residents of Delta State, the Police Command has arrested Mr. Efe Onoetiyi, a 30-year-old man accused of murdering his best friend, Paulinus Okon, after allegedly embezzling over N50 million he got from him.

Addressing journalists on Monday, the Commissioner of Police, Delta State Command, CP Abaniwonda Olufemi, described the incident as particularly tragic and outlined the gruesome details of the crime during a press briefing held in Asaba.

Alongside Efe Onoetiyi, four other suspects connected to the heinous act were also paraded.

"This briefing involves a deeply painful case—the brutal murder of Paulinus Okon by his trusted friend, Efe Onoetiyi," CP Olufemi began.

"Paulinus was reported missing on September 8, 2024, by his brother after he left home in the company of Efe Onoetiyi. Initially, Efe denied any knowledge of his friend's whereabouts and even visited Paulinus's family to feign concern."

Efe reportedly tried to manipulate the family further by demanding N500,000 to "consult a herbalist" who could allegedly reveal Paulinus' location.

According to CP Olufemi, Efe later fabricated a story about Paulinus being kidnapped and collected a ransom of N20,715,000 from the victim's family under the pretence of negotiating with the supposed kidnappers.

When suspicions arose about Efe's inconsistent narratives, the case was



transferred to the State Criminal Investigation Department in Asaba.

However, his evasive behaviour persisted until November 28, 2024, when the Divisional Police Officer (DPO) of Ekpan, acting on CP Olufemi's directive, launched a discreet and intelligence-led investigation.

The breakthrough came with the arrest of one Okeimute Gaga, a 48-year-old man implicated in the crime. Under interrogation, Okeimute confessed to his involvement and provided a harrowing account of the events leading to Paulinus's murder.

According to Okeimute, Efe orchestrated the killing, taking Paulinus to the Orere River in Otokutu on the night of September 8, 2024.

Okeimute revealed that Efe, along with Sunday Ikpeba and a 30-year-old herbalist named Lawrence Joseph, tied Paulinus to a stake near the river. In a horrifying turn of events, they beheaded him.

The confession marked a significant turning point in the investigation,

shedding light on the extent of the betrayal and the motives behind the crime.

CP Olufemi emphasised the role of greed and deceit in the case, noting that Efe's actions stemmed from his desire to control the N50 million he had siphoned from his late friend.

The Commissioner assured the public that justice would be served.

"This Command remains committed to ensuring that every individual involved in this gruesome act is held accountable. Our thoughts are with the family of the deceased during this difficult time," he stated.

The suspects, including Efe and his coconspirators, are now in custody, and efforts are ongoing to prosecute them to the fullest extent of the law. The case serves as a stark reminder of the importance of vigilance and the devastating consequences of misplaced trust.

As the investigation continues, the people of Delta State are left grappling with the shock of such a heinous betrayal within their midst.

George, who once served as Military Governor of Ondo State, said Tinubu's remarks failed to acknowledge the severe hardship Nigerians were enduring.

Speaking during his appearance on Channels Television's Politics Today, the former Chairman of the Nigerian Ports Authority(NPA) referenced three recent food stampedes that claimed 67 lives across Nigeria, saying,"it was as a result of theworsening hunger and frustration in the country."

He further accused Tinubu of being disconnected from reality, insisting that the President's claim that his reforms were effective is contradicted by rising



poverty, struggling businesses, and widespread despair.

,The former national vicechairman of South West zone of the People's Democratic Party (PDP),added: "Things are getting worse every day. Hunger doesn't care about rhetoric; people need real solutions."

George slammed Tinubu's media chat as an inappropriate way to close the year.

"I was shocked by the lack of humility or a somber tone in

the discussion. What's the purpose of engaging the public if there's no acknowledgment of their struggles?" he questioned.

George called for an immediate reduction in fuel prices and urged the government to provide relief measures for impoverished Nigerians.

The PDP Board of Trustees member added that the Tinubu's administration's policies had deepened the economic woes of millions of Nigerians.

COAS orders troops to intensify fight against oil theft By Friday Omosola

n a decisive move to combat oil theft and revitalise Nigeria's oil production, the Chief of Army Staff (COAS), Lieutenant General Olufemi Oluyede, has directed troops of the 6 Division of the Nigerian Army to strengthen their operations against economic sabotage.

Vehicle rams into Gombe Christmas procession, many injured

The Gombe State Police Command has confirmed the incident, emphasizing that it was not premeditated.

According to the Gombe State Police Public Relations Officer, DSP Buhari Abdullahi, the accident involved a Sharon vehicle that was reportedly overloaded with grains, including several bags placed precariously on the rooftop.

Addressing rumours circulating on social media, which described the incident as a massacre, DSP Abdullahi urged the public to exercise caution in their interpretations.

"I think what happened was an accident. The Sharon vehicle involved was overloaded with grains. On the rooftop, it had bags of grains. To say it's a massacre means it was a deliberate attempt," he explained, seeking to dispel misinformation



about the tragic event.

Eyewitnesses at the scene recounted moments of panic and confusion as the vehicle lost control and ploughed into the procession. Many of the injured were rushed to nearby medical facilities for treatment, though the extent of their injuries has not been disclosed at the time of this report.

The annual Christmas procession is a significant cultural and religious event in Gombe State, drawing participants and spectators from across the region. The disruption caused by the accident has sparked discussions on the need for enhanced safety measures during such gatherings, particularly along major roadways.

As investigations into the incident continue, the Gombe State Police Command has assured the public that it is committed to uncovering the exact circumstances that led to the accident.

The driver of the vehicle, whose identity remains undisclosed, is reportedly in custody, and further updates are expected as inquiries progress.

Meanwhile, community leaders and religious organizations have expressed their solidarity with the victims and their families, urging calm and unity during this challenging time.

They have also called for greater collaboration between authorities and organizers of public events to prevent such occurrences in the future.

Chrismas day crackdown: NDLEA arrests 34 suspects in Kano

peratives of National D r u g L a w Enforcement Agency (NDLEA) have arrested 34 suspects with different quantities of illicit substances in Kano State.

The Kano command's spokesman, ASN Sadiq Muhammad-Maigatari announced this in a statement he signed on Wednesday.

Muhammad-Maigatari said the suspects were arrested during a raid, as part of proactive measures to ensure a safe and drug-free Kano during the Christmas and New Year celebration.

Part of the statement read, "On December 24, the agency dislodged several notorious drug joints across the state.

These drug dens are located in Fagge Area, Sani Abacha Stadium, Danagundi, and the historically infamous Filin Idi drug den."

He said the command successfully recovered a substantial amount of illicit substances such as cannabis sativa, 'suck and die', and Exol-5, among others.



According to Muhammad-Maigatari, other recovered items include dangerous arms being used by drug peddlers to attack officers.

"The drug users will receive the necessary counseling and support to aid their recovery," he assured.

The commander noted that the seizures demonstrated the agency's commitment to dismantling drug networks and curbing the availability of harmful substances within the community during the festive seasons.

He noted that investigations were ongoing and those found culpable would be charged to court upon completion of investigation.

Osun Assembly approves 2025 budget, adds N37bn

sun State House of Assembly has officially passed the 2025 Appropriation Bill, raising the total budget to N427.7 billion from the initial N390 billion presented by Governor Ademola Adeleke.

The increase reflects the Assembly's commitment to addressing key developmental priorities and ensuring adequate funding for critical sectors.

This milestone was announced on Monday through a statement issued by Olamide Tiamiyu, Chief Press Secretary to the Speaker.

The statement confirmed the bill's passage following the presentation of a comprehensive report by Mr. Olumide Fatunmise, Chairman of the House Committee on Finance and Appropriation.

Governor Adeleke initially presented the budget proposal of N390,028,277,740 for the 2025 fiscal year to the Assembly on Wednesday, November 13.

Breaking down the figures, the budget projected a total revenue of N390,028,277,740, comprising an opening balance of N30,001,125,120, recurrent revenue—including FAAC allocations — of N306,649,908,010, and capital receipts amounting to N53,377,244,610.

The total expenditure mirrored the proposed revenue at N390,028,277,740. Recurrent



expenditure was set at N245,797,093,940, covering personnel costs of N102,895,821,010 and other recurrent expenses totalling N142,901,272,930. Capital expenditure stood at N144,231,183,800.

During his budget presentation, Adeleke underscored his administration's progress in road infrastructure, revealing that 80% of existing gaps have been addressed, substantially reducing deficits.

Adeleke, in November 2024, presented the state's 2025 appropriation bill to the House of Assembly, commending the lawmakers for their continued support of his administration. He initially presented N390bn 2025

budget to the Assembly.

In November 2023, he presented N273,908,997,410.00 for the 2024 fiscal year.

He noted that the focus is to ensure the bill, once signed into law, delivers tangible benefits to Osun residents.

"The Osun State House of Assembly on Monday officially passed the 2025 Appropriation Bill of the state, amounting to N427,746,925,170 into law," the statement read.

"The approval followed the presentation of a report by the House Committee on Finance and Appropriation, led by its Chairman, Hon. Olumide Fatunmise."

Christmas: Delayed December salaries hits FG workers

ederal Government workers are facing a low-key Christmas celebrations following the delay in payment of their December 2024 salaries.

According to The PUNCH, the workers also suffered delayed salaries in November 2024.

The reports said that most federal workers received their November 2024 salaries during the second week of December.


While a number of people within the civil service said the fault came from the office of the Accountant General of the Federation, others noted that the delay was as a result of migration to a new payment platform.

Speaking on the delayed salaries, some civil servants at the Federal Secretariat on Tuesday morning, expressed their grievances over the matter.

A worker, who spoke under the condition of anonymity out of regard for civil service rules, said, "To be very honest, I am not traveling for the holidays this year because I don't have the money. Our November salaries came very late and by the time we were paid, a lot of us were already in debt. We felt things would be different this December but the reverse is the case."

Another civil servant, who also spoke under the condition of anonymity, said, "There is nothing shocking about this new development because our November salaries came late. Some of us prepared ahead, even though it is not enough. The cost of food items have gone up, clothes for my children and all. Payment of the December salaries at the moment will really go a long way."





However, the Federal Government has explained the reasons behind recent delays in salary payments to civil servants, attributing the issue to shortfalls in allocations to some ministries and agencies.

Speaking with newsmen on Tuesday, the Director of Press and Public Relations at the Office of the Accountant-General, Mr Bawa Mokwa, confirmed that payments commenced on Monday and that measures had been taken to address the discrepancies.

"They have started paying since yesterday," Mokwa stated.

He further acknowledged the delays experienced last month, saying, "Last month, you will observe that some people didn't get their salaries on time. Some ministries were having shortfall. Yesterday, they paid all, and even the ones that had shortfall, they ensured that they were augmented and paid. So, it now depends on the



banks."

Explaining the root of the problem, Mokwa noted that the implementation of the new minimum wage had affected the salary allocations for some ministries.

"When they started paying the new minimum wage, the money assigned for salaries to these ministries was affected by the minimum wage. So, that led to shortfall for the ministries. That is what the government has addressed and augmented for all ministries to ensure that the salary was paid yesterday," he explained.

The Accountant-General of the Federation, Dr Oluwatoyin Madein, also confirmed during an earlier event that the salaries had been paid.

However, Mokwa added that the timing of the funds reflecting in employees' accounts would depend on individual banks.

"It varies from bank to bank on how it will drop, but they have been paid," he said

In July 2024, President Bola Tinubu approved an increase in the minimum wage for Nigerian workers from N30,000 to N70,000.

Fire razes goods, equipment worth over N200m

oods and equipment valued at over №200 million were lost in a devastating fire outbreak early Wednesday morning at Ibokwu Street, near Old Market Road, Onitsha, Anambra State.

According to reports, the fire broke out around 9:15 a.m. when most shop owners were away celebrating Christmas.

Efforts of concerned individuals contained the fire and prevented it from spreading to nearby shops and residential buildings.

However, fire service officials failed to respond to emergency calls during the incident.

The affected shops were part of attachment buildings located at the now-defunct General Post Office in Onitsha. The structure, reportedly sold to a businessman from the state, had previously housed artisans, booksellers, and lawyers.

Sources disclosed that pressure from the new property owner had been mounting, urging tenants in the surrounding areas to vacate.

On Tuesday, some of these individuals were allegedly barred from conducting business within the premises.

By 9:38 a.m., some shop owners were seen salvaging partially burnt goods, while others, whose belongings were completely destroyed, were lamenting their losses.

This incident has raised concerns about the state of emergency response in the area, as many believe timely intervention could have minimized the losses.

One of the affected shop owners, Chinedu Nnamdi, who also lives close to Ibokwu Street, and the fire incident scene said he saw smoke from far and thought somebody was burning some waste because the shops were closed for Christmas celebration, not knowing that it



was smoke from fire that engulfed their shops, until he was called by his neighbours to come to rescue his things.

Some of the equipment affected are DI machines, said to cost over N2 million per one, fridges and generators, computers, printing machines, stationary, and other different work equipment artisans use there.

The cause of the fire incident is not yet known as at the time of filing this report, but some of the eye witnesses who participated in fire fighting to prevent the inferno spreading to nearby houses said it could be as a result of electrical spark.

Catholic priest, several clerics arrested over Abuja stampede By Elizabeth Jenrola Oso

n unnamed top Catholic priest and several officials of the Holy Trinity Catholic Church, Maitama, Abuja, were on Tuesday arrested following a tragic stampede that claimed 10 lives during a charity food distribution event.

The incident, which occurred at the church's premises, has led to widespread criticism with sources confirming that those detained will remain in custody and could spend Christmas behind bars.

The arrests follow demands by the Islamic activist group, Muslim Rights Concern (MURIC), which called for similar action against organizers of the Abuja event and a separate tragedy in Okija, Anambra State, where 22 people lost their lives during a billionaire's charity event.

MURIC argued for fairness, stating



that organizers of a similar incident in Ibadan, Oyo State, which included a former Ooni of Ife queen and a popular radio broadcaster, Oriyomi Hamzat were charged and remanded.

Inspector General of Police, Dr. Kayode Egbetokun, has ordered

investigations into the Abuja and Anambra events.

Reacting to the arrests, Catholic Archbishop of Abuja Diocese, Most Rev. Ignatius Kaigama, expressed disapproval of what he termed the "verbal demonisation of the Catholic Church" by government agents.

In his Christmas message, titled "Christmas: A Season of Hope and Renewal," Kaigama criticised the arrest and detention of church officials, calling it "uninspiring, unfriendly, and a misplaced zeal."

He urged government authorities to support the church in addressing the trauma of the tragedy rather than exacerbating it through threats of prosecution.

Kidnappers strangle 10-yr-old boy after collecting ransom By Elizabeth Jenrola Oso

Abdullahi, was brutally murdered by his kidnappers at the Rikkos community in the Jos North Local Government Area of Plateau State.

Abdullahi was said to have been killed after his parents paid N150,000 as part of the ransom demanded.

The lifeless body of the boy was, however, discovered in a sack on Friday near his family's house.

The deceased's uncle, Aliyu Muhammad, told newsmen on Tuesday that the boy was kidnapped in front of his family house on Monday, December 16, after he was lured away by unknown individuals.

According to him, the abductors contacted the family five days later, demanding a sum of N50,000 for the



boy's feeding and a ransom of N1 million, threatening to kill the boy if the demanded money was not paid on time or if the family report to the police.

He said that the kidnappers eventually agreed to collect N300,000 after rounds of negotiations out of which they were paid N150,000 as the first instalment.

He said, "After paying N150,000 through a bank transfer, as instructed by the abductors, we were shocked to receive a call from a woman the following day, informing us that our child had been killed and abandoned near our house.

"Upon examining the body of the deceased, we observed that our son had been strangled, with blood coming out of his nose and mouth."

The man said two suspects were reportedly arrested in connection with the incident.

Efforts to speak with the spokesman of the Plateau State Police Command, DSP Alabo Alfred were unsuccessful as calls to his number did not go through and he did not respond to text messages sent to his phone.



The statement read, "The NUSA President-General attempted to reach Mrs Busisiwe Sibanyoni, via telephone but was unsuccessful. A WhatsApp message was sent; however, she had not responded at the time of this report's compilation.

"A witness who was at the scene of the shooting incident was contacted and provided the investigating officer's details. NUSA's legal team followed up with the officer confirming that a murder investigation has been launched and remains active.

"NUSA's legal team is gathering information and liaising with the family.






Meanwhile, a Nigerian, Mr Ade, is calling the attention of Nigerians and the Nigerian embassy to the sad situation as his body has been seized by his ex wife.

In videos sighted by LIB, Ade said Chinedu was killed shortly after his wife, Busisiwe Sibanyoni, called him that she was coming over to his house to pick the kids despite it being the day the victim was supposed to spend with the children.

He also alleged that Busisiwe's friend sent him a DM telling him that she is refusing to return the victim's body home because she is afraid his family will perform some sort of voodoo on the corpse so the victim can haunt whoever killed him.

Christmas Day Attack: Russia fires 70 missiles, 100 drones into Ukraine

ussia launched an "inhumane" attack on Ukraine's energy infrastructure on Christmas Day, with explosions reported across the country, Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelensky said.

It is the thirteenth time this year Russia has carried out a major attack on Ukraine's power grid, according to DTEK, the country's largest energy provider, leaving it in a precarious position while the war grinds into a third winter.

At least one person died in the attacks in the eastern Dnipropetrovsk region, while six others were injured in Kharkiv – less than 20 miles from the Russian border – Ukraine's national police said, adding that residential buildings and civilian infrastructure were damaged in the attack.

At least seven missile strikes targeted the city, regional governor, Oleh Syniehubov said.

Half a million households have been left without heating in the Kharkiv region in temperatures of 3 degrees Celsius (37 degrees Fahrenheit). Kyiv has imposed rolling blackouts to stabilize the grid, DTEK said.

Ukrainian forces meanwhile said Wednesday that they attacked a Russian command post overnight in Lgov in the Kursk region, where Kyiv launched a surprise offensive this year.

Four people were killed and five have been hospitalised, including one woman in a serious condition, according to local authorities in the Kursk region.

In Russia's North Ossetia-Alania, the ministry of defence said an explosion and fire in a shopping center in Vladikavkaz was caused by falling debris from a droneZelensky calls Putin 'inhumane'



shot down by air defence forces Wednesday morning which killed one person.

Attack comes after Xmas day switch

Prior to 2023, most Ukrainians celebrated Christmas on January 7 under the Julian church calendar, but last year Zelensky signed a law formally changing the date as a way of further distancing the country from the traditions of the Russian Orthodox Church – and bringing it in line with much of the rest of Europe.

Ukraine created its own independent Orthodox Church of Ukraine in 2018, splitting from the Moscow-affiliated Ukrainian Orthodox Church (UOC). Since then, religious affiliation has increasingly been viewed as a symbol of national loyalty.

The holiday is now celebrated by Ukrainian Orthodox Christians on December 25, and Zelensky said Russia's intentions were clear.

"Every massive Russian strike requires time for preparation. It is never a spontaneous decision. It is a deliberate choice – not only of targets but also of timing and date," Zelensky said.

"Today, Putin deliberately chose Christmas for an attack. What could be more inhumane?"

Russia launched more than 70 missiles on Wednesday, including ballistic missiles, and more than 100 attack drones targeting Ukraine's energy infrastructure, he said, adding more than 50 missiles were shot down along with a "significant" number of drones.

"Unfortunately, there are hits. As of now, there are blackouts in several regions," he added.

DTEK said the attacks severely damaged equipment at its thermal power plants across the country.

38 killed as Azerbaijan plane crashes in Kazakhstan

t least 38 passengers have died as an Azerbaijan plane carrying 67 people crashed on Christmas day in Kazakhstan, local authorities have confirmed.

According to the emergency ministry, preliminary reports indicate that 25 people survived the crash, with 22 of them taken to the hospital for treatment.

The Embraer 190 aircraft, operated by Azerbaijan Airlines, reportedly caught fire upon crashing near Aktau city on Wednesday. Officials have confirmed that the fire has since been extinguished.



The transport ministry disclosed that the flight, identified as Azerbaijan Airlines J2-8243, was en route Baku, Azerbaijan to Grozny, Russia, carrying 62 passengers and five crew members.

The aircraft was allegedly diverted due to heavy fog conditions.

Investigations into the cause of the crash are underway.

UN General Assembly moves to combat cybercrime globally

he United Nations General Assembly has adopted the Convention against Cybercrime, a landmark global treaty aimed at strengthening international cooperation to combat cybercrime and protecting societies from digital threats.

The agreement on the legally binding treaty marked the culmination of a five-year effort by UN Member States, with inputs from civil society, information security experts, academia and the private sector.

UN Secretary-General, António Guterres, welcomed the adoption of the Convention – the first international criminal justice treaty to have been negotiated in over 20 years.

"This treaty is a demonstration of multilateralism succeeding during difficult times and reflects the collective will of Member States to promote international cooperation to prevent and combat cybercrime," his spokesperson said in a statement.

The statement added that the Convention "creates an unprecedented platform for collaboration" in the exchange of evidence, protection for victims, and prevention while safeguarding human rights online.

"The secretary-general trusts that the new treaty will promote a safe cyberspace and calls on all States to join the Convention and to implement it in cooperation with relevant stakeholders," the statement added.

Philémon Yang, President of the General Assembly, highlighted the importance of the new Convention.

"We live in a digital world, one where



information and communications technologies have enormous potential for the development of societies, but also increases the potential threat of cybercrime.

"With the adoption of this Convention, Member States have at hand the tools and means to strengthen international cooperation in preventing and combating cybercrime, protecting people and their rights online," he said.

The resolution containing the Convention was adopted without a vote by the 193-member General Assembly.

Ghada Waly, Executive Director of the UN Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) also described the adoption of the treaty as a "major victory" for multilateralism.

According to her, it is a crucial step forward in the global efforts to address crimes like online child sexual abuse, sophisticated online scams, and money laundering.

Waly reiterated the UN agency's commitment to support all nations in signing, ratifying, and implementing the new treaty, as well as providing them with the tools and support they

need to protect their economies and safeguard the digital sphere from cybercrime.

The Convention against Cybercrime acknowledges the significant risks posed by the misuse of information and communications technologies (ICT), which enable criminal activities on an unprecedented scale, speed, and scope.

It highlights the adverse impacts such crimes can have on States, enterprises, and the well-being of individuals and society, and focuses on protecting them from offenses such as terrorism, human trafficking, drug smuggling and online financial crimes.

It also recognises the growing impact of cybercrime on victims and prioritises justice, especially for vulnerable groups. It further underscores the need for technical assistance, capacity-building, and collaboration among States and other stakeholders.

The Convention against Cybercrime will open for signature at a formal ceremony to be hosted in Hanoi, Vietnam, in 2025. It will enter into force 90 days after being ratified by the 40th signatory.

Biden, Trump send different Christmas messages

he outgoing and incoming U.S. presidents had different messages for the Christmas holiday, with Democrat Joe Biden urging Americans to reflect and unite and Republican Donald Trump offering a holiday greeting and a flurry of politically focused social media posts.

Biden narrated a video tour of the White House Christmas decorations that was published on YouTube late on Christmas Eve, in which he urges Americans to set aside "all the noise and everything that divides us."

"We're here on this Earth to care for one another, to love one another," Biden says in a voiceover as a camera pans past adorned evergreen trees and bedecked fireplaces inside the White House. "Too often we see each other as enemies, not as neighbours, not as fellow Americans," he said.

Biden urged Americans to find a moment of "quiet reflection" to remind themselves to treat each other with dignity and respect, "live in the light" and remember there was more to unite than divide Americans. "We're truly blessed to live in this nation," he



said.

Trump published a mid-morning "Merry Christmas" message on Truth Social on Christmas Day with a photo of himself and his wife Melania, followed by over two dozen retweets of articles or other social media posts that backed his political positions on topics including controversial Defence Secretary nominee Pete Hegseth and his pursuit of Greenland and the Panama Canal.

One was a mocking meme of Barack Obama that shows a photo of the 44th President and Trump at the 2017 inauguration with the message "When you see the guy who said 'you'll never be president' at your inauguration."

Biden took office in 2021 vowing to "end this uncivil war that pits red against blue, rural versus urban, conservative versus liberal," and said he bowed out of the 2024 presidential race in July to unite the country.

By some measures, polarization in the country has increased instead, including during the 2024 campaign that pits Biden against Trump, again, before Democrat Kamala Harris took over.

Trump has called for the prosecution of perceived political enemies and vowed to restructure the federal government.

A 33-year-old Guatemalan migrant, Sebastian Zapeta, was arrested after allegedly setting a woman on fire aboard a stationary subway train.

Witnesses and officials described a chilling scene as Zapeta reportedly watched the woman burn to death.

The incident occurred on the F train shortly after 6 a.m. Commuters were stunned to see flames and smoke billowing from the train car, triggering an immediate response from Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA) staff.

According to authorities, Zapeta had lit a match and thrown it at the victim, who was reportedly seated and surrounded by liquor bottles. Despite efforts by MTA employees to extinguish the fire, the woman succumbed to her injuries at the scene.

Zapeta, who had remained at the station after the attack, was later seen sitting calmly on a bench near the train car. Surveillance footage and body camera recordings captured his presence. Hours later, he was apprehended on a Manhattan-bound train at the 34th Street station, wearing the same clothes from the attack. A lighter was found in his possession during the arrest.

Authorities revealed that Zapeta entered the United States illegally through Arizona in 2018.



Investigators are working to confirm his immigration status and determine a possible motive for the heinous act. Witness accounts suggest that Zapeta may have been intoxicated and ranting before the incident.

"This is a shocking and deeply disturbing attack," said an NYPD spokesperson during a press conference. "The victim's identity is still being withheld as we notify her family. Our thoughts are with them during this incredibly difficult time."

The attack has raised renewed concerns about safety in New York City's subway system, which has seen a spike in violent incidents despite recent efforts to enhance security.

Governor Kathy Hochul had recently assured New Yorkers of improved safety measures, but this incident has left many questioning the effectiveness of those claims.

Social media erupted in outrage after

videos of the incident began circulating online. One video purportedly shows Zapeta throwing the lit match at the victim before calmly observing the flames. "How could someone do this?" commented one user. "This is pure evil."

For many, the attack symbolizes a broader crisis of mental health, homelessness, and public safety in New York City. Transit advocates and city officials are calling for swift action to address the root causes of such violence.

Sebastian Zapeta remains in custody as the investigation continues. He faces multiple charges, including murder and arson. The NYPD has urged anyone with additional information about the incident to come forward.

The city mourns yet another life lost to senseless violence, a grim reminder of the challenges that still plague New York's public transit system.

Druglord, Ochoa walks free in Colombia after 20 years in US prisons

ne of Colombia's infamous drug lords and a key operator of the Medellin cartel has been deported back to the South American country, after serving 25 years of a 30-year prison sentence in the United States.

A short while later, Fabio Ochoa was again a free man.

Ochoa arrived in Bogota's El Dorado airport on a deportation flight on Monday, wearing a gray sweatshirt and carrying his personal belongings in a plastic bag. After stepping out of the plane, the former cartel boss was met by immigration officials in bullet proof vests. There were no police on site to detain him.

Colombia's national immigration agency promptly posted a brief statement on the social media platform X, saying Ochoa was "freed so that he could join his family" after immigration officials took his fingerprints and confirmed through a database that he is not wanted by Colombian authorities.

Ochoa, 67, and his older brothers amassed a fortune when cocaine started flooding the US in the late 1970s and early 1980s, according to US authorities, to the point that in 1987 they were included in Forbes magazine's list of billionaires.

Living in Miami, Ochoa ran a distribution centre for the cocaine cartel once headed by Pablo Escobar. Escobar died in a shootout with authorities in Medellin in 1993.

Ochoa was first indicted in the US for his alleged role in the 1986 killing of Barry Seal, an American pilot who



flew cocaine flights for the Medellin cartel, but became an informant for the Drug Enforcement Administration.

Along with his two older brothers, Juan David and Jorge Luis, Ochoa turned himself in to Colombian authorities in the early 1990s under a deal in which they avoided being extradited to the US.

The three brothers were released from prison in 1996, but Ochoa was arrested again three years later for drug trafficking and was extradited to the US in 2001 in response to an indictment in Miami naming him and more than 40 people as part of a drug smuggling conspiracy.

He was the only suspect in that group who opted to go to trial, resulting in his conviction and a 30-year sentence. The other defendants got much lighter prison terms because most of them cooperated with the government.

Ochoa's name has faded from popular memory as Mexican drug traffickers take center stage in the global drug trade. But the former member of the Medellin cartel was recently depicted in the Netflix series "Griselda," where he first fights the plucky businesswoman Griselda Blanco for control of Miami's cocaine market, and then makes an alliance with the drug trafficker, played by Sofia Vergara.

Ochoa is also depicted in the Netflix series "Narcos," as the youngest son of an elite Medellin family that is into ranching and horse breeding and cuts a sharp contrast with Escobar, who came from more humble roots.

Richard Gregorie, a retired assistant US attorney who was on the prosecution team that convicted Ochoa, said authorities were never able to seize all of the Ochoa family's illicit drug proceeds and he expects that the former mafia boss will have a welcome return home.

"He won't be retiring a poor man, that's for sure," Gregorie told the Associated Press earlier this month.

Postecoglou calls for January reinforcements as Spurs struggle

ottenham manager Ange Postecoglou has called for reinforcements in the January transfer window, admitting the squad is "short in a couple of areas" amid a challenging run of form.

Spurs have slipped to 11th in the Premier League after losing three of their last four games, including a 6-3 home defeat to Liverpool. Key injuries to goalkeeper Guglielmo Vicario and defenders Micky van de Ven and Cristian Romero have compounded their struggles.

"We've been planning for a while," said the Australian. "It's fair to say we're still short in a couple of areas and need to reinforce. January is tricky, but we need players who will make us stronger."



Despite domestic struggles, Spurs remain competitive in cup competitions, reaching the Carabao Cup semi-finals after a dramatic 4-3 win over Manchester United and staying in the hunt for Europa League progression. They also face Tamworth in the FA Cup third round on January 12.

Postecoglou defended his players' effort and dismissed criticism of his tactics, stating: "The players are giving maximum effort and doing what I'm asking of them. How can I be critical of that?"

The Spurs boss also addressed his fiery exchange with a reporter after the Liverpool loss, attributing his reaction to repeated questions about defensive injuries. "I wasn't angry, but it's tiring to hear the same things after every defeat," he said.

With a busy schedule ahead, Postecoglou is determined to bolster his squad and navigate the demanding second half of the season.

Embiid ejected after heated clash with referee in 76ers win over Spurs

Carlos Corberan appointed Valencia head coach amid relegation battle

a Liga strugglers Valencia have appointed Carlos Corberan as their new head coach, bringing the Spaniard back to his homeland after an impressive stint with West Bromwich Albion.

Corberan, 41, has signed a contract until the end of the 2026-27 season, taking over from Ruben Baraja, who was sacked following Valencia's poor start to the campaign, with just two wins in 17 league matches.

Valencia triggered Corberan's release clause, reportedly between £3-4 million, to secure his services. The appointment comes as the club sits second-bottom in La Liga, four points from safety, and prepares to face reigning champions Real Madrid on January 3.

A Difficult Departure In a heartfelt message, Corberan described leaving Albion as "the hardest decision of my life," expressing gratitude to the club and its supporters.

"There will always be a place in my heart for this special club, and I hope one day I can return to thank you all for your incredible support," he said on social media.

Corberan transformed West Brom during his tenure, taking them from relegation candidates
