

Terrorism Allegation By Niger: ECOWAS backs Nigeria, other member states

he Economic of West A frican States (ECOWAS) has said it is solidly behind Nigeria and other member states being accused by Niger Republic of sponsoring terrorist attacks against it.

Niger Republic had accused Nigeria and other ECOWAS members of colluding with France to destabilise the country.

However, ECOWAS in a statement on Thursday described the allegations as "unfounded."

"The Commission of the Economic and West African Staes (ECOWAS) expresses deep concern over allegations being made against Nigeria and other ECOWAS member states.

"The Commission stands firmly by Nigeria and ECOWAS member states against allegations that they are sponsoring terrorism.

"For years, Nigeria has supported peace and security of



several countries not only in the West African subregion but also on the African continent.

"The recent successes recorded by the Multinational Joint Task Force (MNJTF), which Nigeria leads, demonstrate the country's commitment to peace and security across the region.

"ECOWAS therefore, refutes any suggestion that such a generous and magnanimous country would become a statesponsor of terrorism," the statement read in part.

ECOWAS then called on all states in the region to promote dialogue and stability and refrain from making accusations that are not supported by any evidence.

The Federal Government had on Thursday denied Niger Republic's allegation.

The Minister of Information and National Orientation, Mohammed Idris, made the rebuttal in a statement, amid claims by Niger Republic's military leader, General Abdourahamane Tchiani, that Nigeria was working with France against his country.

"These claims exist solely in the realm of imagination. Nigeria has never engaged in any alliance, overt or covert, with France—or any other country—to destabilize Niger Republic," the statement read.

11 reportedly killed in fresh Benue attacks By Dave Oludare Oso

unmen have reportedly willed at least 11 people in an attack on some communities in Nyiev-ya, Kwande Local Government Area of Benue State.

The attacks were perpetrated on December 25 when the people were celebrating Christmas with their families.

A resident in the community confirmed the attack in a telephone conversation on Thursday.

The resident, who preferred to be anonymous, told Channels Television that they received a distress message that "Nyiev-ya is under attack."

the resident said, "The terrorist herders came this afternoon (December 25), and invaded Ubutu and GSS Anwase, killing and burning houses.

"Daniel Jam's son was killed by the terrorists. Pray for our community for God's and Government intervention."

While the killing was going on in Tse Azege community, another resident also informed that an attack was also ongoing in Ityuluv, in Nyiev-ya community.

"If there is anything the chairman or the government can



do, let it be fast. The news coming from Kwande is still not pleasant. Terrorist herders have continued with their onslaught against our people today, (December 25)," he said.

The President General of Mzough U Tiv, (MUT) Worldwide, CP Iorbee Ihagh (retired), who hails from Kwande LGA, said the community head in the area confirmed the attack.

He described the attack as unprovoked and said several people were killed on Christmas Day.

"11 people were reportedly killed during the attack on Kwande LGA yesterday. The attack was unprovoked but the attackers who were herdsmen invaded the communities and attacked the people.

"Many are still missing. Leaders of the affected communities have reported the attack at the police station."

Another native, Solomon Amande, whose community was affected, confirmed the death of 11 persons.

He claimed the killings were carried out by armed herders and militia groups.

The Benue State Police Command is yet to react to the latest attacks in both Katsina-Ala and Kwande local government areas.

When contacted, the Command's spokesperson, Sewuese Anene, said she had no information on the incidents.

FG summons airline CEOs over flight delays, cancellations By Dave Oludare Oso

ollowing the consistent flight delays and cancellations during the festive season, the Director-General of the Nigeria Civil Aviation Authority (NCAA), Chris Najomo, has convened a meeting with airlines' Chief Executive Officers (CEOs).

Disclosing this on his X handle on Thursday, the Director of Public Affairs and Consumer Protection, NCAA, Michael Achimugu said Najomo is cutting short an important assignment to meet with all the CEOs of domestic airlines in Nigeria on Friday.

Recounting an experience he had while trying to catch his flight, Achimugu said, "I walked into the scene this evening while trying to catch a flight myself. Passengers were really angry and threatened to become violent.

"I personally addressed them and engaged for about 20 minutes, explaining that I would confirm from the Nigerian Meteorological Agency, NiMET, if the weather was truly bad. I also explained that the airline does not have liability in the event of force majeure.'



According to him, despite this, he took certain measures to address the concerns of passengers.

"I insisted that the airline provide transportation back to the Central area for all passengers. I paid for nearby accommodation (Peace Media Hotel) for a few elderly passengers who looked too weak after the lengthy wait.

"The airline agreed to pay 50 per cent compensation to the passengers and agreed to also refund those who sought a

refund. "I told the passengers that they could redeem that 50 per cent by cash rather than rebate if they wanted.

"I opened my phone and let as many passengers as possible to scan the NCAA QR code for passengers complaints, and told them to contact me if the airline fails to resolve their complaints by tomorrow morning," Achimugu explained.

The director recalled that a few days ago the NCAA announced it would enforce action against five airlines, adding that this will be the first time in more than 10 years that the Consumer Protection Department of the NCAA is taking such action.

He further stated that he had written to NiMET to begin sending daily weather reports directly to his office, which would enable me to ascertain quickly if an airline lies about weather.

Achimugu said three days ago, he voted some money from his salary to some indigent passengers owed refunds by a certain airline whose current situation is critical.

I sacked Secondus as PDP Chairman because of Fubara – Wike

yesom Wike, Minister of Federal Capital Territory (FCT), has revealed why he orchestrated the removal of Uche Secondus as National Chairman of the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP).

The minister spoke as a special guest of honour at an end of year thanksgiving organised on Thursday by the PDP stakeholders in Ahoada East and Ahoada West at Ukpata community in Ekpeye Kingdom.

The thanksgiving was put together by former Deputy Speaker, House of Representatives, Chibudum Nwuche; Chairman, Rivers State PDP Elders' Council, Chief Ferdinand Alabraba; members of House of Representatives from the area, Solomon Bob and Victor Obuzor, and member of the state House of Assembly, Dame Queen Williams.

The former governor also called Celestine Omehia an imbecile for saying that he had attracted nothing to Rivers as a minister.

The Minister disclosed that he kicked Secondus out of office as the PDP National Chairman because he hatched a plot to make his cousin and former deputy governor, Tele Ikuru, Rivers governor in place of Siminalayi Fubara.

He said Celestine Omehia was stopped from becoming a governor of Rivers through the backdoor, adding that the PDP chieftain lacked knowledge of the functions of an FCT Minister.

He said though he could not bring infrastructural projects to Rivers as the FCT Minister, he has been helping Rivers people.

Wike added that no governor had



attracted more appointments to his state than him in the present administration of President Bola Tinubu.

"I heard Secondus said the other day in Bori, I awarded the Bori Internal Road. I paid 50 per cent, and thinking that we have a governor that we all agreed to continue, Secondus was saying that his enemies; who are the enemies of the governor?

"Secondus that refused him to be governor. I kicked out Secondus as PDP chairman when he wanted to make his cousin Tele Ikuru to be governor.

"Today, he is saying now that we are enemies.

"He was the one who refused the man to be governor. He wanted his cousin to be governor.

"He has now become the governor's friend and we have now become the enemies. To God be the glory."

On Omehia, Wike said: "He said they should ask me what have I done for Rivers State. That is why I say he is an imbecile.

"I am not a minister of a ministry, I am a minister of the Federal Capital Territory.

"When I was Minister of Education,

he would have challenged me: 'what did you bring to Rivers State?'

"As Minister of Education, I brought Faculty of Law to University of Port Harcourt. I gave grants to Ken Saro-Wiwa Polytechnic, I gave grant to Ignatius Ajuru University, the Federal government College, Port Harcourt, Federal Government Girls College, Abuloma; I renovated them to be what a school is supposed to be.

"That is what I thought he should be asking me.

"Now I am the minister of the FCT, I cannot bring road to Rivers State, I cannot take FCT money to Rivers State but I can help Rivers people. And I have been helping Rivers people.

"Let it be on record that by the instrumentality of Mr President, there is no governor in this state that attracted more political appointments in this state than myself. Go and count it.

"By the instrumentality of Mr President by his grace, by his love for us, he said, go and give me these names for political appointments."

"So, Mr Omehia, are you not aware that Rivers people have more political appointments than even when you are serving somebody? Are you not aware?

God (#BRILLIANT ARIN) joked: "VeryDarkMan said they hacked and stole №180m from his NGO website lmao. That's a familiar method: set camera, blow up, then begin to use foolish scope for the fools who are their stan/audience."

Calls for Cybersecurity Awareness Amid the skepticism, some highlighted the importance of cybersecurity in Nigeria.

Vincent The Therapist (#mrhighfoster) emphasised: "This is why cybersecurity should be taken seriously in Nigeria. When you know you have a public account receiving a large amount of money, you should enforce its security."

As the controversy unfolds, netizens continue to demand clarity and accountability from Martins Otse.

Troops slay two notorious bandit commanders, Muchelli, Ma'oli

s part of their continued offensive against terrorist Lelements in the North West part of Nigeria, troops of Operation Fansan Yamma have killed notorious bandit leaders in Katsina and Zamfara states.

Troops successfully conducted an operation in Mai Sheka village, Kunchin Kalgo town, in Katsina State, neutralizing an unascertained number of terrorists, including a notorious kingpin, Alhaji Ma'oli.

According to Zagazola Makama, a Lake Chad Basin counterterrorism and insurgency expert, intelligence sources said Ma'oli was responsible for imposing levies and engaging in criminal activities in Unguwan Rogo, Mai Sheka, Magazawa,

Police nab 153 suspected robbers in Oyo

he Oyo State Police Command has announced the arrest of 153 suspected armed robbers across various locations in the state over the past six months.

During a press briefing held at the command's headquarters in Eleyele, Ibadan on Friday, the Commissioner of Police, Ayodele Sonubi, detailed the progress made in combating crime within the state.

According to Sonubi, the police successfully recovered 12 stolen vehicles of various brands and 12 motorcycles/tricycles from the suspects.

The arrests and recoveries underscore the command's commitment to ensuring the safety and security of Oyo State residents.

Further investigations into the cases are ongoing as the command works to bring the culprits to justice.

Sonubi said, "The state police command is pleased to inform residents that within the past six months and 11 days, it has recorded significant successes in reducing crime rates across the state.

"This was attained through a combination of intelligence-led operations, community engagements and proactive policing.



"From June 16 to this day, 153 armed robbery suspects were arrested, 12 stolen vehicles and 12 motorcycles/tricycles were recovered while 48 firearms and 1,396 rounds of various calibre of ammunition were retrieved from the possession of criminals."

The CP, who also paraded 36 suspects for various criminal offences, added that they were picked up at various locations in the 33 Local Government Areas of the state.

He stressed that their offences range from armed robbery to kidnapping, hijacking and diversion of trucks loaded with various items, and other vices.

Sonubi, therefore, directed Area Commanders, Divisional Police O ffi c e r s , H e a d s o f Department/formations and Tactical Commanders to deploy adequate personnel and resources across the state.

"As we gradually bid 2024 farewell, I have ordered that all Area Commanders, Divisional

Police Officers, Heads of Department/formations and Tactical Commanders deploy adequate personnel and resources throughout the length and breadth of the state, particularly at all critical infrastructures, recreational facilities, media houses, banks, correctional centres, public spaces, places of worship and all adjoining highways and routes within and outside the state.

"Similarly, I have directed that all Area Commanders, Divisional Police Officers and Tactical Commanders to increase layers of supervision around their subordinates, particularly men on the field who daily interface with commuters and other civilian populations.

"The command's monitoring and X-squad units have also been tasked to deal decisively with any officer whose actions or inactions bring about embarrassment to the command and by extension the police force, through extortion, incivilities and other professional misconducts," Sonubi said.

Opposition knocks APC as Lagosians queue for palliatives at Tinubu's residence

he opposition Labour Party (LP), Peoples Democratic Party (PDP), and others have condemned the ruling All Progressives Congress (APC) over the worsening poverty in Nigeria.

Their criticism followed a viral video showing large crowds queuing for foodstuffs at President Bola Tinubu's residence on Bourdillon Road. Lagos, on Christmas Eve.

The footage, shared by Senator Ali Ndume on his official X account, drew widespread attention.

"Queues for presidential handouts at Bourdillon on Christmas Eve highlight a sobering reality. Poverty knows no tribe, religion, politics, or region. It is a universal challenge that demands collective action and sustainable solutions," Ndume remarked.

The incident comes amid rising hardship across the country, including recent stampedes at food distribution events in Oyo, Anambra, and Abuja, which claimed over 50 lives.

Opposition Criticisms

Labour Party's National Publicity Secretary, Obiora Ifoh, expressed concern about the growing poverty, accusing the APC of turning Nigerians into beggars.

"The statistics are out there for everyone to see. Imagine buying a bag of rice for N100,000 during Christmas. It's now clear to the blind and audible to the deaf that there is hunger in the land," Ifoh stated.

LP's 2023 presidential candidate, Peter Obi, also lamented the dire economic situation, blaming



Tinubu's policies.

"It's heartbreaking to see a nation with so much promise struggling to provide for its people," Obi said through his media aide, Umar Ibrahim.

The PDP's Deputy National Youth Leader, Timothy Osadolor, accused Tinubu's administration of "weaponising poverty."

"Nigerians may reach a point of desperation where they turn against the political elite. This presidency has reduced the dignity of the common man to a pauper state," he warned.

The National Publicity Secretary of the Young People's Party, Egbeola Martins, called for an urgent review of the government's economic policies, particularly the subsidy removal, which he described as "antimasses."

APC's Defence

In response, APC National Publicity Director Bala Ibrahim dismissed the criticisms, defending Tinubu's actions as consistent with his longstanding generosity.

"Tinubu has been doing this for ages. This is not new. The only difference is that now, as President, his generosity is under greater scrutiny," Ibrahim said.

He accused the opposition of attempting to incite Nigerians against Tinubu, stating, "The critics grandstand, but if Tinubu extended this generosity to them, they would queue up too. This is a man who genuinely feels for the ordinary citizen."

Ibrahim argued that the President's actions reflect his commitment to alleviating hardship rather than a political manoeuvre, citing Tinubu's history of philanthropy.

As poverty and unemployment rates soar, with over 40% of Nigerians living below the poverty line, the call for economic reforms grows louder. Critics insist that immediate action is needed to prevent the nation from sliding further into economic despair.

The APC government continues to face mounting pressure to address these challenges and implement sustainable solutions for the benefit of the populace.

Sokoto accidental airstrike: Villagers harbouring terrorists - Military; Atiku, others demand probe

n response to the Christmas day bombing of civilians in two communities in the Silame Local Government Area of Sokoto State by the Nigerian Air Force, the Chief of Defence Staff, General Christopher Musa, has warned civilians against harbouring terrorists and criminals.

The CDS, who spoke during his visit to the troops of Operation FASAN YANMA at 8 Division Headquarters in Sokoto, said any community that persists in such acts (harbouring terrorists) should be ready to face the consequences of their actions.

NEW DAILY PRIME reported that an airstrike intended to neutralise Lakurawa terrorists, mistakenly hit Gidan Sama and Rumtuwa communities, killing at least 10 villagers and leaving several others wounded on Christmas eve.

However, several Nigerians, notable among whom are former Vice President Atiku Abubakar, Governor Ahmed Aliyu of Sokoto State, and ex-Sokoto governor, Aminu Tambuwal, have called for an impartial investigation into the incident.

But speaking to journalists on the accidental bombing, Musa hinted that the villagers were to blame for allegedly harbouring terrorists, insisting that the military would not take any responsibility for attacks on any community hobnobbing with the militants.

He stated, "I want to call on everyone not to harbour any suspected criminals in their midst, be it Lakurawa or bandits. They should expose them and leave their vicinity.

"The military is not going to take it lightly with any criminals disturbing the peace of the nation, we are dealing with them and we are coming for the rest.

"We have individuals that still harbour them and once you do that, you are making yourself a legitimate target. We appeal, do not harbour them, do not live with them to avoid being a legitimate target.

"Please, do not hang around them, do not give them any support in whatever ways



because once you do that, you are making yourself a target."

The Defence Chief added, "The incident that happened yesterday was an operation we did, we did a follow-up and we try as much as we can to avoid any mistakes; if there are other mistakes that came up in the operation, we will investigate.

"We did our homework, we have the video of everything that happened and we are going to investigate."

While calling on the media not to give the bandits or other criminal elements much publicity, the CDS said the country would not allow any foreign military base on Nigerian soil.

He called Niger, Chad, Benin and other neighbouring countries to cooperate with Nigeria in dealing with the enemies of peace.

Speaking to the troops of Operation FASAN YAMMA, during the luncheon, he said, "I want to extend my heartfelt appreciation to every one of you for your unwavering dedication and sacrifices in ensuring the safety and security of Nigeria, particularly in your deployment to the Joint Task Force Northwest Operation FANSAN YAMMA.

"Despite the inherent challenges, your daily commitment to duty in the field remains a source of inspiration to us all and further exemplifies the true spirit of patriotism required for defeating the threats to our nation's peace and stability.

"The recent deployment of the Special Operations Brigade and some combat enablers to dislodge and eliminate the Lakurawa terrorists from their camps in Sokoto and Kebbi states, and the successes so far achieved is a testament to our commitment to resolving and combating all security threats across the theatres of operations.

"Accordingly, and under my leadership, the Armed Forces of Nigeria will continue to sustain its operational tempo and posture across military deployments both home and abroad," he reassured.

He encouraged the troops to gear up for the challenges ahead by ensuring victory across all the theatres of operations.

"The coming year presents us with an opportunity to make significant progress in overcoming the challenges confronting our nation.

"Together, we must strive to ensure that the Year 2025 is marked by transformative victories in all our operational theatres, particularly in Operation FANSAN YAMMA," he noted.

The CDS pledged the necessary support and resources to the troops to carry out their tasks effectively.

Musa later visited the military hospital to check on some troops receiving treatment.

Meanwhile, Governor Aliyu has visited the Gidan Sama and Rumtuwa communities to assess the damage and offer condolences to the victims' families.

The governor announced a donation of N20 million and 100 bags of assorted food items for the grieving families.

Tax Reforms: Tinubu calling for anarchy – Gov Mohammed

He said, "We join our Christian brothers to celebrate this day, the birthday of Jesus Christ. And we use this opportunity as the government of Bauchi State, to thank the people, to thank the Christians for their support over the years, especially for my dear party, the PDP and my humble self.

"Even when I was in ANPP, Christians helped me and voted for me, and they voted for me despite my limitations and my gaps.

"I appreciate your support all through, even when we came for the second term. You deserve our appreciation because you have earned it.

"You are my brothers and sisters because I am a special breed of person. Most of you are my tribesmen.

"We come from the same source, we only believe differently. You are free to practice your religion. I am free to practice my religion. There is no compulsion in religion.

"I call on you to pray for Nigeria. Pray for all the leaders of Nigeria, including my humble self because Nigeria needs prayers. We are facing a lot of difficulties. There is a lot of wahala. According to the statement, he was serving as the Manager of the Schools of Nursing, Midwifery, and Medical Laboratory at Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital, Ihiala before he was brutally murdered.

"The Catholic Diocese of Nnewi has called on the faithful to offer prayers and Holy Masses for the eternal rest of Fr. Tobias and to console his bereaved family.

"Funeral arrangements will be announced in due course.

The Diocese urged authorities to investigate the incident and bring the perpetrators to justice.

"As the Catholic community mourns the loss of this dedicated priest, they take comfort in the statement: "Where sorrow increases, divine consolation increases all the more."

Leonard also defended his wife's autonomy, asserting that she has the right to make her own decisions without judgment or assumptions. "She can post Christmas photos without me in them," he stated. "She can take breaks and not wear her ring. I bought the ring, and I'm not complaining. She can go on vacation without me—it's not your business." Leonard made it clear that Peggy's choices are hers alone, and no one else has the right to impose judgment on her actions.

"Stop trying to judge the innocent actresses who star alongside me," he wrote. "They are professionals getting paid to do their job and put food on their tables." Leonard made it clear that his career is not affected by the opinions of those who judge him based on his roles. "For those who choose to judge my true nature as a person by the roles I play in movies, it goes to show how daft you are, and that's not my fault," he added. "It's not my job to boost your I.Q."

Farage threatens legal action over membership row with Badenoch

eform UK leader demands an apology from Kemi Badenoch over accusation the party had produced 'fake' data

Nigel Farage has warned of possible legal action against Kemi Badenoch, demanding an apology after she accused him of falsifying Reform UK's membership numbers. Farage, calling the claim "outrageous," urged Badenoch to retract her statement, describing it as an "intemperate outburst."

Speaking on a Zoom call, Farage said he would take action within days but had not decided on the specifics.

The dispute began when Farage claimed Reform UK's membership had surpassed the Conservatives'. Badenoch responded on social media, accusing Reform of using a counter "coded to tick up automatically." Reform's chair, Zia Yusuf, provided evidence to the Financial Times showing the party's membership numbers were legitimate, including data from their Nation Builder platform, which tracks memberships and donations.

Farage criticized the Conservatives for not publicly auditing their own membership figures, alleging that they include people who had left the party or died.

He reaffirmed Reform's willingness to have its figures independently



audited and urged the Conservatives to do the same.

The row, the first direct confrontation between Badenoch and Farage, comes as the Conservatives attempt to recover from their worst electoral defeat in July. Reform UK, expanding its membership base, is gearing up for a significant ground campaign ahead of local elections in May, seeking to establish itself as a credible political force.

Reform's membership tracker shows nearly 142,500 members compared to the Conservatives' 131,680, as reported during their recent leadership election.

Critics close to Badenoch dismissed Farage's claims as a publicity stunt. One source referred to Farage as "Fake Farage," suggesting the



membership counter's credibility is questionable. Farage, however, insists the Conservatives will "bitterly regret" their accusations.

The clash underscores broader concerns about the transparency of UK political party membership figures. Unlike the Liberal Democrats, Greens, and Labour, who openly share membership data, the Conservatives have faced criticism for withholding theirs. As Reform grows, it faces pressure to prove its staying power in the political landscape.

The outcome of this dispute could shape the dynamics between Reform UK and the Conservatives, as both parties vie for public trust in a highly competitive political environment.

Accuser in rape lawsuit against Jay-Z, Diddy can remain anonymous – Judge

n Alabama woman who says she was raped by Jay-Z and Sean "Diddy" Combs when she was 13 can proceed anonymously, for now, in her lawsuit against the rap moguls, a New York federal judge ruled Thursday.

In her written order, U.S. District Judge Analisa Torres said the woman can proceed anonymously at this early stage of the litigation, but she may be required to reveal her identity at a later date, if the case proceeds. That would allow defense lawyers to collect facts necessary to prepare for trial. Torres also cited "substantial interest" from the public.

The Manhattan jurist also chastised Alex Spiro — the lawyer representing Jay-Z, whose legal name is Shawn Carter — for what she described as his "relentless filing of combative motions containing inflammatory language and ad hominem attacks" against the plaintiff's lawyer, calling them "inappropriate, a waste of judicial resources, and a tactic unlikely to benefit his client."

Torres wrote in her order Thursday that Spiro, who has been on the case less than three weeks, has submitted a "litany of letters and motions attempting to impugn the character of Plaintiff's lawyer, many of them expounding on the purported 'urgency' of this case."

In response to the ruling, Tony Buzbee, the plaintiff's attorney, told CBS News in an email Thursday evening that he doesn't "typically comment on court rulings," but alleged that "the coordinated and desperate efforts to attack me as counsel for alleged victims are falling flat."



CBS News has reached out to Carter's attorneys for comment.

Combs remains jailed in New York awaiting a criminal trial on federal sex trafficking charges. He also faces a wave of sexual assault lawsuits, many of which were filed by Buzbee, a Texas attorney who says his firm represents over 150 people, both men and women, who allege sexual abuse and exploitation by Combs.

The lawsuits allege many individuals were abused at parties in New York, California and Florida after receiving drug-laced drinks.

Combs' lawyers have dismissed Buzbee's lawsuits as "shameless publicity stunts, designed to extract payments from celebrities who fear having lies spread about them, just as lies have been spread about Mr. Combs." Jay-Z has said in a statement that Buzbee is trying to blackmail him to settle the Alabama woman's allegations.

In her lawsuit, the woman who says she was raped at 13 identifies herself as "Jane Doe."

She said she was living in Rochester in

2000 when she made her way to New York City and befriended a limousine driver who drove her to an after-party for the MTV Music Awards, where she says she was eventually attacked by Jay-Z and Combs.

Spiro asked the judge to dismiss the entertainer from the woman's lawsuit and he requested a hearing on the case for the day after he made his requests in writing on Dec. 18.

Citing an interview the plaintiff did with NBC News, Spiro wrote that the broadcast revealed "glaring inconsistencies and outright impossibilities" in the plaintiff's story. For one thing, the woman said she traveled for five hours from Rochester to watch the music awards show on a jumbotron outside the VMAs even though permits and pictures show there was no jumbotron at the event.

Spiro also noted that the woman's father has said he does not recall driving from Rochester to pick his daughter up in New York City, as she says he did.

In the interview, the woman admitted to inconsistencies in her story.

China teaches love to promotes dating and marriage By Dr. Olaoluwa Vincent Ajayi

n a significant effort to foster a birth-friendly society, the LChinese government has introduced a series of incentives to encourage single people to date, marry, and have children. Starting January 1, 2025, couples registering their first marriage, where the woman is aged 35 or younger, will receive a cash reward of 1,500 yuan (\$214). Families having their first, second, or third child will be eligible for subsidies of 2,000 yuan (\$285), 5,000 yuan (\$714), and 8,000 yuan (\$1,142), respectively, provided they meet policy guidelines. Universities have been asked to introduce socalled love courses for single students, and regular articles appear in state media about the benefits of having children.

The initiative, announced by the Lüliang City Civil Affairs Bureau, is part of a comprehensive program to support marriage, childbirth, and education. Authorities are also focusing on improving maternal and child healthcare. This includes standardizing practices in health institutions, training village doctors, upgrading pediatric services in general hospitals, and enhancing the expertise of obstetricians and pediatricians.

China is grappling with an unprecedented demographic challenge as its population declines for the first time in 60 years, with fertility rates at historic lows. In 2022, marriage registrations dropped to 6.83 million, the lowest since 1986. These trends are compounded by economic uncertainty and shifting societal values, as many young people move away from traditional life paths due to a slowing economy, rising unemployment, and mounting financial pressures.

In response, governments across China are intensifying efforts to promote marriage and childbirth. Local officials are cold-calling married women to inquire about their plans for children, universities are



introducing "love courses" to encourage dating among students, and state media frequently publishes articles extolling the benefits of family life and parenthood to influence public attitudes.

Experts caution that these efforts face significant obstacles. Ren Zeping, a prominent economist, has described the crisis as a convergence of three trends: an ageing population, low birth rates, and declining marriage rates. With fewer young people and a rapidly ageing society, the implications for China's economy and labor force are severe. India officially surpassed China as the world's most populous nation last year, underscoring the urgency of the issue.

Economic pessimism further exacerbates the problem. Policymakers are grappling with a prolonged property downturn, weak exports, and stagnant consumer confidence, all of which deter family planning. "Having a child is a lifelong responsibility," noted one expert. "Economic uncertainty is a

strong counterforce to improving the birth rate."

Despite the relaxation of the onechild policy in 2016, birth rates have fallen every year since, and financial incentives for parents have largely failed to reverse the trend. Cultural shifts, including a greater focus on career ambitions and personal freedom among women, pose additional challenges. "Chinese women's desire to have children is low," said Lü Pin, a Chinese feminist writer. "There is no sign this will change, even with increased subsidies and growing concerns about the demographic crisis."

As Lüliang implements its incentives, many hope the measures will serve as a blueprint for addressing the broader challenges of declining birth rates and a shrinking population. Whether these efforts will be enough to reverse the trends remains uncertain, but they highlight an increasing awareness of the urgency of China's demographic predicament.

US gay couple jailed 200 years for raping adopted sons

gay couple resident in Georgia, the United States, William and Zachary Zulock, aged 34 and 36, have been sentenced to life in prison for sexually abusing their adopted sons.

A Walton County court, last week, imposed 100-year sentences on each, without the possibility of parole. The victims, two brothers, are now 12 and 10 years old, The Economic Times reports.

The Zulocks reportedly adopted the boys from a Christian special-needs agency and lived in an Atlanta suburb.

Zachary worked in banking, and William was a government employee.

The abuse reportedly involved forcing the children into sexual acts and creating pornographic videos.

Evidence revealed the Zulocks shared details of the abuse with others, with one instance involving Zachary sending a Snapchat message saying, "I'm going to f-k my son tonight.



Stand by," along with images of McGinley was quoted as saying, the abuse.

The Economic Times reports that the gay couple's crimes became known after a member of a local pedophile ring was caught downloading child pornography.

The arrested suspect revealed the Zulocks' involvement in producing child pornography with their adopted sons.

During their trial, both men pleaded guilty to aggravated child molestation, aggravated sodomy, and sexual exploitation of children.

The District Attorney Randy

McGinley was quoted as saying, "These two defendants truly created a house of horrors and put their extremely dark desires above everything and everyone else."

McGinley further commended the victims' strength, adding, "However, the depth of the defendants' depravity, which is as deep as it gets, is not greater than the resolve of those that fought for justice and the strength of the victims in this case.

"The resolve I have seen from these two young victims over the last two years is truly inspiring."

Lawmakers impeach Acting South Korean President, Duck-Soo

or decades, South Korea was an example of a vibrant democracy and economy. On Friday, the key United States ally was in uncharted territory when legislators voted to impeach an acting president less than two weeks after ousting the country's previous leader.

The ruling People's Power Party surrounded the speaker's podium following the vote to impeach acting President Han Duck-soo, chanting that the vote was invalid and accusing parliament of committing "tyranny."

On Dec. 14, President Yoon Suk Yeol was himself impeached after attempting to declare martial law. Opinion polls conducted after Yoon's bid to impose military rule show overwhelming public support for his removal.

Choi Sang-mok, the former Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Economy and Finance, replaced Han, becoming South Korea's second acting president in two weeks.

Before the vote, National Assembly Speaker Woo Won-shik said impeaching the acting president required a simple majority of lawmakers present, the same threshold as for impeaching a prime minister.

While the ruling People Power Party argued that a two-thirds majority, the threshold for a presidential impeachment, was necessary, it decided its members would abstain



from voting if only a simple majority was required.

"I respect the decision of the National Assembly and, in accordance with relevant laws, I will suspend my duties to avoid adding further confusion and uncertainty," Han said in a statement shortly after the impeachment motion was passed against him.

This situation raises significant legal and political challenges as South Korea navigates its first impeachment of an acting president.

Han's impeachment coincided with the Constitutional Court's first hearing to review whether to overturn the impeachment and reinstate Yoon or remove him permanently from office, with a decision due in 180 days.

Following the impeachment, Choi said that the government had ordered the military to increase vigilance, citing the possibility that North Korea could exploit the South's political instability to carry out acts of

provocation.

"As a member of the Cabinet, I feel a deep sense of responsibility for the current situation and extend my heartfelt apologies to the people," Choi said.

"At this moment, minimizing confusion in state affairs is of utmost importance," he added, according to the statement his office sent NBC News. "The government will do its best to ensure stability in governance." "We should carry out a watertight preparation against North Korean provocation," he said.

The plan to impeach Han — with 192 of the 300 legislators voted for the motion — was announced by the main opposition Democratic Party of Korea (DPK) on Thursday, after he refused to immediately appoint three justices to fill vacancies at the Constitutional Court.

Italian journalist, Cecilia Sala arrested in Iran

n Italian journalist has been under arrest in Iran for more than a week, Italy's foreign ministry has said.

Cecilia Sala works for Il Foglio newspaper and for podcast company Chora Media.

The foreign ministry said it was following Ms Sala's case with "utmost attention" since she was detained by Tehran police on 19 December.

There was no immediate confirmation of the arrest by Iranian officials.

Chora Media said in a separate statement that Ms Sala was being held in solitary confinement at the Evin prison in Tehran and that no reason had been given for her arrest.

Italy's foreign ministry revealed that Rome's ambassador to Tehran, Paola Amadei, had paid her a visit to check on the conditions in which she was being held, adding that she had been allowed to make two phone calls to her family.

It also said Italy "has been working with Iranian authorities to clarify Cecilia Sala's legal situation."



According to Chora Media, Ms Sala left Rome for Iran on 12 December with a valid journalist visa and had carried out several interviews, producing three episodes of her "Stories" podcast.

It added that she had been due to fly back to Rome on 20 December, but her phone went "silent" after she exchanged a few messages on 19 December.

Sala's other employer, Il Foglio, has called for her release, saying "journalism is not a crime."

"Cecilia was in Iran, with a regular visa, to report on a country she knows and loves, a country in which information is suffocated by repression," the newspaper said in a statement on its website.

Last week, Iran summoned the Swiss ambassador in Tehran and a senior Italian diplomat over the arrest of two Iranian nationals, Reuters reported, citing Iranian media.

Iran was rocked by protests in 2022 after the death of 22-year-old Mahsa Amini in September of that year. Tens of thousands of people were arrested in connection with the "Woman, Life, Freedom" protests.

Mahsa had been arrested for allegedly breaking Iranian laws that require women to wear the hijab and she died in police custody.

Terrorist shouts 'Allahu Akbar' murders woman, 83, in Israel By Elizabeth Jenrola Oso

28-year-old terrorist from Tulkarem in Samaria shouted "Allahu Akbar" and then stabbed and mortally wounded a woman near the nursing home where she lived on Kedoshi Hashoah Street in Herzliya on Friday morning.

Magen David Adom emergency personnel treated the victim, Ludmila Lipovsky, 83, and she was evacuated in critical condition to Tel Aviv Sourasky Medical Center (Ichilov Hospital), where doctors pronounced her death.

Security guards from the Israel Postal Company's Brink's courier unit shot the lone attacker, who was then arrested by police.

According to initial reports, he was within the Green Line illegally and had previously served time in an Israeli prison for a security offense. His condition is described as serious.



The terrorist, Ibrahim Shalhob, had been placed under administrative detention three times, most recently from June 2023 to June 2024.

The Israel Security Agency (Shin Bet) said the suspect is "a former security service informant, who was involved in

thwarting terrorist infrastructures in Judea and Samaria, [and] was exposed and transferred for rehabilitation in Israel. The suspect was arrested at the scene and will be transferred for Shin Bet interrogation to continue investigating the circumstances of the attack."

No possibility of 3rd world war – Putin

n spite of worldwide belief, Russian President Vladimir Putin has dismissed the possibility of a third worldwar.

Vladimir Putin has stressed the need for balance in addressing escalating global tensions and conflicts.

Speaking with journalist Pavel Zarubin on December 24, the Russian president cautioned against fear-mongering.

"There's no need to scare anyone," Putin spoke about third world war.

Putin also acknowledged growing dangers and accused Russia's opponents of heightening tensions deliberately.

"If that's what they want, let them escalate further. We will always respond to any challenge," he said.



However, despite Putin's reassurances of not pursuing a full-scale war, those close to him are convinced that he views the current conflict as a holy war and has long since passed the point of no return.

And the Russian ruler will settle for nothing less than the complete subjugation of Ukraine or the country's destruction.

The terrifying scale of Putin's war aims in Ukraine may seem unthinkable to most rational outside observers, but they make perfect sense when viewed through the prism of his toxic worldview.

Throughout his reign, Putin has been driven by a deep-seated resentment of Russia's post-Soviet decline and a burning desire to revive the country's superpower status. revealed that he does not plan to go into coaching but may look to become a club owner following his retirement.

WHAT RONALDO SAID

Speaking at the Globe Soccer Awards on Friday, Ronaldo said: "I'm not a coach. I'm never going to be a coach, president of the club? No. Maybe owner of the club.

When asked if he plans to become a club owner, Ronaldo replied: "Probably. I will see. It will depend on the moment, the right opportunities.

"Have I got any in mind? Not yet, a few maybe."

THE BIGGER PICTURE

At the moment, there is no real

clue as to which club Ronaldo may look to buy after his retirement as all his former clubs barring Sporting CP may be a little out of his budget despite having a reported net worth of £636 million (\$800m).

However, as per SportBible, Ronaldo could also be offered a chance to buy a club in the Saudi Pro League as the Public Investment Fund (PIF) will be keen to keep him in the country.

Man Utd boss Amorim admits he could be sacked after Red Devils' slump

anchester United boss, Ruben Amorim admitted that he could be sacked amid his struggles to reverse Red Devils'slump.

Amorim, who joined Manchester United from Sporting Lisbon for a £9.2 million buyout fee, has endured a challenging start.

Under his tenure, the team has lost five out of their ten matches, prompting concerns about the manager's ability to steer the club back on course.

His appointment came with high expectations, especially considering United's decision to pay an additional £900,000 beyond his buyout clause to secure him midseason.

However, the results have fallen short of expectations, with the team struggling to adapt to Amorim's methods in the limited time available. Speaking candidly about the situation, Amorim admitted that no manager at Manchester United can afford to feel secure, given the pressures and stakes involved.

"I know the business that I'm in," said Amorim. "The manager of Manchester United can never, no matter what, be comfortable. I know that if we don't win, regardless, if they pay the buyout or not, I know that every manager is in danger. I like that because that is the job, so I understand the question. You can argue that I have been here one month and I've had four training (sessions), but we are not winning. That is the reality and I'm quite comfortable with that."

Amorim admitted that the transition has been more difficult than expected but is focused on "the job" – to win matches as quickly as possible.

"There's no point talking about that or thinking about that. I'm here and have to focus on the job," he added.

"It's part of football to have these difficult moments. I already knew that was going to be tough. You expect to win more games, to have players with more confidence to sell the idea and to work and improve things. At this moment it's really hard. We have to survive to have time and then to improve the team."

Adding to United's woes, they will face an in-form Newcastle United on Monday without two key players. Captain Bruno Fernandes will miss the match following his red card in the 2-0 loss to Wolves on Boxing Day, while midfielder Manuel Ugarte is suspended after accumulating his fifth booking of the season.

The team's recent run of three consecutive defeats has only amplified the pressure on Amorim. A victory against Newcastle at Old Trafford would be crucial for regaining momentum and easing the scrutiny surrounding the manager's position.
